

# Auckland Orienteering Club – 2025 President’s Report

I wasn’t entirely sure what to expect stepping into the President role at the AGM in 2024. At the time, I was only temporarily back in New Zealand to get a visa before heading back to Boston, USA. That soon became Europe as I moved between events during the European summer, before attending the Australian Orienteering Championships and ultimately settling in Adelaide.

Being remote has its challenges, mainly managing time zones, not being present at events and not being fully immersed with club members. I want to acknowledge the committee for their willingness to work with me. They, along with all the volunteers, are the backbone of the club. Without their ongoing support and eyes on the ground, being a remote president would have been impossible.

It has been another exceptional year for our club, filled with achievements, quality events and opportunities that continue to strengthen both the club and the sport of orienteering. As always, the end of the year brings a time for reflection on what we do well as a club, what we can improve and the direction we want to head in.

## A Year of International Representation

2025 was another successful year for AOC athletes on the world stage. Our juniors and seniors represented New Zealand with distinction at events including the World Orienteering Championships in Finland, the World Games in China, World Cup 1 in Sweden, World Cup 2 in Belgium, the Junior World Orienteering Championships in Italy, the European Youth Orienteering Championships in Czechia and the Southern Cross Junior Challenge in Australia.

Special congratulations to our club members selected for national teams. These selections reflect the time and effort invested in developing your orienteering ability.

## Domestic Competitions and Club Achievements

At home, AOC members had strong showings across the New Zealand Orienteering Championships, King’s Birthday Championships and Oceania Championships. High participation across all age groups was impressive, with 92, 118 and 80 club members attending respectively. AOC athletes achieved multiple podium finishes in both individual and relay events, demonstrating depth across age groups and experience levels.

The Forest Cup returned with five races across familiar and new venues, and the AOC Club Champs at Woodhill provided close competition for club glory. The Winter Sprint Series,



SummerNav and Night Street events continued to engage the Auckland orienteering community, promoting skill development and accessible competition.

## Volunteer Contribution and Club Culture

Our club thrives thanks to volunteers who plan, control and support events. This year we introduced a policy to recognise those in key roles with expense reimbursements and incentives, including additional support for juniors. This acknowledges the time and commitment required to keep our club running smoothly.

Special thanks to our planners, controllers, event coordinators and all members who assisted at events. Your efforts ensure that Auckland Orienteering Club remains welcoming, well-run and vibrant. A special mention goes to everyone involved in organising the 2025 New Zealand Secondary Schools Orienteering Championships. Hosting a major event takes significant time to ensure everything runs smoothly. Despite some less than ideal weather, the event was a success, the courses were excellent and the club once again demonstrated that we can consistently deliver high-quality competitions.



## Membership


Overall, club membership is similar to 2024, with total members slightly down by 2%. Membership types have shifted, with more individuals joining rather than families.

## In Memorium

The club lost two long-standing members in 2025, Nicholas Oram and Vyacheslav (Vee) Smirnov. Both contributed greatly to the club and will be missed.

### Nicholas Oram

Nicholas was a dedicated member who contributed quietly and consistently over many years, from setting events to volunteering and introducing orienteering to schools. His efforts made a lasting impact on our club and the wider orienteering community.

### Vyacheslav (Vee) Smirnov

Vee began orienteering in 1962 in Ukraine and went on to found an orienteering sport school, serve as president of the Ukraine Orienteering Federation and author a book on orienteering. After moving to New Zealand, Vee continued to give tirelessly, supporting school map development and KiwiSport programmes alongside Irene Smirnova and Leon McGivern.

### Mattia Debertolis

I would also like to acknowledge Italian athlete Mattia Debertolis, 29, who collapsed during the men's middle distance at the World Games in August, passing away a few days later. His death is a sobering reminder of the challenges athletes face in extreme conditions and to make the most of life while you can.

Following this incident the IOF has reviewed and updated specific rules related to heat conditions at future events.

## Looking Ahead to 2026

Next year promises to be just as exciting.

AOC will host the 2026 Team Trials Weekend for athletes vying for selection on the EYOC, JWOC and WUOC teams. The Auckland Triple Crown will return over King's Birthday weekend, with World Ranking status.

Members will continue to represent the club domestically and internationally. Locally, Club Nights, forest events and sprint competitions offer opportunities to develop skills, meet fellow orienteers and enjoy the sport in a supportive environment.
